



Heritage Status Report for Stand 102 Horison (16 August 2018)

| Declaration Status | The property is not a declared or provisionally declared heritage site. It does not fall within a heritage area. |
| Sixty Year Status | We visited the plans archive and found a microfilm of plans dating from 1957 (see images below). Unfortunately the quality is incredibly poor so adding details about the context and purpose is difficult. We would recommend working on the assumption that parts of the property were built in 1957 making them older than sixty years. |

| What this means | The owner will need to apply for a permit from the Provincial Heritage Resources Authority Gauteng (PHRAG) before carrying out any work (alterations, additions, demolitions etc.). Click here for contact details and application forms. Section 34 of the National Heritage Resources Act states that 'No person may alter or demolish any structure or part of a structure which is older than 60 years without a permit issued by the relevant provincial heritage resources authority'. 'Alter' is defined by the Act as 'any action affecting the structure, appearance or physical properties of a place or object, whether by way of structural or other works, by painting, plastering or other decoration or any other means'. |
