#### PRE-HISTORY OF SITE:

By 1922, the Reid Brothers Building stood at 22 Harrison and 92 Main Streets. By 1954, the building was the premises of Corlet Drive Motor Services.

The Silesia Building (designed by the architect Philip Treeby in 1896), was situated at 94 Main Street.

By 1954, African Indent Merchants A.I.M. (Pty) Ltd traded at 20 Harrison Street, south of the Reid Brothers Building. )

The building houses the offices of the Provincial Department of Finance & Economic Affairs. At the completion of the renovations to the old Reserve Bank (Johannesburg Branch) Building, at the corner of Simmonds and Fox Streets (already known as Matlotlo House), the Treasury Division of the Department would be relocated to the latter building.
