

DESCRIPTION OF PLACE:

The windows of this building are arranged in an interesting pattern, it is reminiscent of the traditional tripartite fashion with a wider middle section and narrower corner sections.

The cantilevered canopy is unique in the sense that the first and second storey (forming the podium) stands flush with it. This forms an interesting variation of the podium and tower building, the ground floor being set back.

The first and second storeys of the building is stepped back; double set of lifts and stairs.

Basement level: storage; A.C. Plant Room; etcetera.

Ground floor : shops and piazza.

First and

second floor : car parking.

Third floor : offices; flowerbox on exterior of

building.

Fourth to

12 floor : offices. 13 floor : plant rooms.

CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS:

Exterior

Walls: reinforced concrete; precast terrazzo cladding panels, ochre coloured; brown

ceramic tiles to ground floor.

Roof: flat, concrete.

Windows: 'shadowlight' glass.

Interior

Floors: vinelex tiles on screed.

Ceiling: suspended.



SITE FEATURES:

The closure of Fraser Street in this area provides the setting for the piazza. The tar road has been substituted with two colours of paving brick, laid to form diamond patterns and borders. The President Street side has a fountain and pool. A double row of palm trees was planted on the Pritchard Street side. A row of low street lamps was placed slightly off centre. The piazza is flanked by the Sage Centre on the east side, and on the west side by the Sage Life Building and Standard Bank Building. All this forms a small oasis in a busy area of the city.


