#### **DESCRIPTION OF PLACE:**

Double storey; no basement level.

#### **CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS:**

Walls: steel frame and brick.

Roof: flat (originally gable/ saddle type).

Windows: steel frame, casement type.

#### **SITE FEATURES:**

#### **ALTERATIONS:**

Addition of new parapet wall to main façade (existing roof was altered to form lean-to against parapet wall); the existing balcony at first floor level over the pavement, was removed to allow for the installation of large fixed plate glass and adjustable glass louvre windows on the entire face of the right section of the main façade; these alterations included the addition of a kiosk (at ground level) to the new section of the façade; there were at this stage, offices and storerooms on the first floor and three separate shops at ground level, i.e. a butcher shop, a bottle store, as well as a fish shop.

Internal alterations and new cantilevered canopy over the old shop front section; this included changes to the old shop front section as well.

Alterations to first floor and conversion of the ground floor for use as a confectionery.

External alterations to main façade: this *inter alia*, included the replacement of the remaining wooden frame windows with 'new' windows (first floor), the installation of aluminium sliding doors to the old shop front section and horizontal aluminium louvres, covering the right section of the top floor of the main façade.

#### **INTEGRITY:**

Has been drastically changed with the result that only the exterior walls and floors, and one console under the roof, have remained. (RAU Report, June 1976)

Notwithstanding the fact that the original plans of the building could not be found, it is clear that what remains of the existing structure, carries very little, if any, integrity. What appears

to have been a nicely proportioned double storey building with distinctively large arched windows at both ground and first floor, became the victim of blatantly unsympathetic changes during and after 1954. (jjb)
